## **Keeping Up with Correspondence**

Are you a great correspondent? Do you answer every letter or email promptly, sending out whatever data or photos your cousin requested? I freely admit to being one of the world's worst correspondents. But I am also determined to do better and I have a plan to develop better habits.

I get all excited when I make email contact with a distant cousin and begin exchanging data. But then somehow I put off answering that last email or that last letter until I'm embarrassed to do so. Things get worse and worse until I have an email inbox full to bursting and a guilt complex to match.

In an attempt to remedy the situation, I have embarked on the following plan. I will:

- sort out emails by surname
- list data for all correspondents
- contact all correspondents
- set aside an evening a week for replies

I am halfway through my plan. I spent hours cleaning out my email inbox and filing genealogical messages in separate folders for each surname I am researching. Then I started a list of people for whom I either owe a letter or email, or from whom I am awaiting an answer. - correspondent's name
- email address
- street address
- notes & comments
- date last message sent
- date last message received

My next task is to write a suitably apologetic message and send it to each and every cousin I have slighted, asking if I owe them data or photos. Do you think they will forgive me? If my plan results in better habits, maybe they won't give up on me entirely.

For those of you who are like me, maybe this plan could work for you,

too. For those of you who already have good correspondence habits, count yourself lucky not to be one of my cousins.

### **Imaging Tips for Better Document Legibility**

#### Tip #1

If, when making a photocopy, the original seems too light to read, simply place a sheet of yellow Milar plastic on the glass. Place your original document on top of the Milar and



continue the copying process. This imaging trick has proven invaluable in copying documents, such as faint receipts, that were almost impossible to read.

Milar can be purchased in most officesupply stores. Be sure to get yellow as no other color will do the trick.

#### **Tip #2**

In working with the census images on Ancestry.com, especially the 1850 Federal Census, you may come across some entries that are nearly illegible due to the darkness of the image. You can make a dark image easier to view by saving it as a bitmap file (.bmp). Then open the file in a paint program or other software that manipulates




images and reverse the image to appear as a negative, which is much easier to read and decipher.

### **Finding Winnow**

Recently, a distant cousin sent me new data on my 5<sup>th</sup> great-grandfather, Benjamin Blackburn, who lived in Virginia and Tennessee in the 18<sup>th</sup> century. I eagerly began to peruse the new information, never suspecting what I would find while reading an excerpt from Benjamin's 1786 will.

"I Do Give and [bequeath] to My Dearly and Well beloved daughter Elizabeth Bay My Negro Wench Named Winnow Which shall Desend to Her Children at Her Death."

I had an ancestor who had owned a slave. Was I dismayed? You bet, even though I had known that, if I kept searching my family history long enough, this was a distinct possibility. I had even told myself that it was more likely to happen in the only southern lines I have, the Blackburns and Bays.

Realistically, I can't hold myself personally responsible for the actions of Benjamin Blackburn more than two centuries ago. Nevertheless, I feel sad about Winnow and find myself wondering who she was. How did she come by the name of Winnow? Did Benjamin or his wife Mary mistreat her? Was she the only slave he owned? How old was she when the will was written? In those days, "wench" could refer to almost any age. Did Winnow travel all the way from eastern Tennessee to near Pittsburgh to become Elizabeth's slave? Or was Winnow sold or freed? Did she marry? Did she have children? Does she have living descendents?

I want to find out about her and somehow tell her story. It feels like the right thing to do, to make up in some small part for Benjamin's wrong. Where do I begin? This is an area of genealogy I've never entered before, filled with slave schedules, articles of manumission, bills of sale, fluid use of surnames that



may have no connection to anyone related to Winnow but only to her owners. It feels overwhelming, so I'm going to start with what I already have, Benjamin's will. My first step is to get a full copy of the will and comb through it for any other details. Then I'm going to locate more exactly where he lived in 1786 and try to find out why his will didn't finish probate until 1791.

I have a long road ahead of me and I don't even know who will listen to her story when I am done. Nevertheless, by reading this, you now know of Winnow's existence so long ago.

It's a start.

## Can You Help with a Mystery Photo?



In 1906, Niels Ebbesen Hansen, a plant explorer for the U.S. Department of Agriculture, returned from Russia with a spoonful of alfalfa seed stock. He called the variety "Cossack" and it quickly became an important crop in South Dakota. Stanley County was one of many areas across the state to grow alfalfa seed successfully and the 1918 crop was particularly good.

Being justifiably proud of this accomplishment, the men associated with the bumper

crop posed for a picture at the Pierre train depot (where the Iron Horse Inn now stands). Unfortunately, this photograph, now in the South Dakota State Archives collection (Pierre general file, #P28), does not identify anyone shown.



## **Access to Vital Records**

Prodded by the concerns of private citizens, law enforcement officers and county employees responsible for vital records in the state of South Dakota, the state took action during the 2005 legislative session to limit access to vital records in South Dakota. Amid growing unease about identity theft and other misuse of personal information, Senate Bill 41 was passed into law and became effective on July 1 of this year. It restricts access to vital records held by county offices and the state to family members, government authorities, those individuals or authorities acting on behalf of a family member, and those doing personal genealogical research.

As with most legislation, a state department (in this case the Department of Health) was tasked with developing the actual rules and regulations that will make the law practicable, while still allowing access for legitimate historical and genealogical research. After several long discussions with the leadership of the South Dakota Genealogical Society, the society and the department agreed on the following requirements for those seeking vital records for genealogical research purposes:

- photo identification
- evidence of membership in a genealogical or historical society

Since that time, the membership requirement has been modified. It is now only necessary to show reasonable proof of being a legitimate researcher.

The agreement with the state society asked the society to issue research cards for those genealogists and historians wishing access to the vital records. A fee of \$5 is payable to the society to cover administrative costs, \$1 of which goes back to the local society, if any.

Over 100 persons have already applied for cards under the new system and the state society is currently handling these requests.


