# **Double Serendipity**

This tale of amazing coincidences begins with the burial of Jacob Fuglsang in 1896, in the Frisk Cemetery, Byron Township, Hughes County, South Dakota. More than a century later, three members of our local society (Virginia Hanson, Susan Assmus and Jessie Elder) and guest Patricia Kirby took a short field trip to locate the cemetery and survey the remaining headstones. We spent a peaceful afternoon along a seldom-used back road, listening to the meadowlarks and enjoying the immense arc of prairie sky.

There were only three stones left of an original 29 monuments. Clustered together and probably not marking the actual resting place of any of these individuals, they made a forlorn grouping. One lay flat, partly covered with weeds; one was pockmarked by bullets; and one had completely lost its top half. Jacob's stone had the following verse:

"The pains of death are past. Labor and sorrow cease. And life's long warfare closed at last. His soul is found in peace."

Later that summer, the society attempted to learn the fate of this little burial ground. We learned that the burials were reinterred somewhere else but we could not discover where. None of the 29 listed individuals could be located in other local cemeteries. We thought we had reached the end of the story.

However, in August, Virginia Hanson, at her position at the South Dakota State Archives, encountered two branches of Jacob's family in a most unusual way. First, she was assisting a visitor to the archives, Ms. Roberta Ramsey of California, when the woman asked how to find information about a local family, the Fuglsangs. Virginia was delighted to share with her the story of our field trip, showing her the rubbings and photographs we had taken. It was a remarkable coincidence but not unheard of.

Within 24 hours, however, serendipity struck again. As Virginia assisted another set of visitors to the archive, Ms. Vicki Roth and her daughter from New York state, they too enquired about the Fuglsang family. Astounded, Virginia again shared her knowledge and asked for permission to bring the two women into contact. Within days, the two branches of Jacob's family were emailing each other, discovering their relationship as cousins and sharing their family histories.

Both had traveled a long distance to do research in Pierre, yet missed each other by barely a day. By astounding good luck, however, both encountered one of only four people in the area who knew of Jacob Fuglsang and his lonely grave on the prairie.

# Don't Tell the Girls: Book Review

Patricia Reilly Giff remembers her grandmothers in a small but warm presentation of family tales. Her charming and wistful memories of her Nana and her search for knowledge of her other grandmother from Ireland will remind all of us of the reasons we do family history.

As a novice genealogist, she learns to start her search with herself and her own memories. Later she describes learning how to speak to librarians and archivists, how to do research and how to let others help when traveling to ancestral places.

An easy-to-read little book with lovely old photographs, it evokes an earlier time as the author describes her closeness with Nana and her longing to have known her Grandmother Jennie. Lest the title mislead you, it is only Nana's warning to the author not to mention to her mother or aunts whatever folly Nana had committed, keeping the secret between the two of them.
